


<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Representation.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ This year I have helped to elect 436 Course Reps and have created a much stronger and more active network of student representation than ever before. ❖ I have also worked with the University to re-write the code of practice on representation and I have made it a key part of their new Learning and Teaching and Student Experience strategy. ❖ I hope to lead the system further into the future and make it the best in the country if not the world. I hope to obtain more admin support for the Zone and use the ERC as more of a research assistant to strengthen the work of representatives. ❖ I want to improve the communication between Course Reps, Faculty Reps and Senate reps and give them a much more visual presence on campus. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Collaboration.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ HUU has worked in partnership this year with the University of Hull and we have obtained some massive student wins as a result. ❖ There has been formal agreement from the University for a redeveloped B.J.L. If re-elected, I hope to take this campaign forwards and ensure that the planning has high levels of student consultation and that the plans are not lost. ❖ The libraries in Hull and Scarborough are now open longer than ever. Open from 7am to Midnight. ❖ There is now a policy on exam feedback stating that all students are entitled to it. ❖ There is provisional agreement from University to move all free-electives to Weds mornings. ❖ New code of practice on student representation.
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Evidence Based Campaigns.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ I firmly believe that all campaigns from HUU should be representative of the student body and stem from significant research. ❖ My Brynmor Jones library campaign and subsequent video, involved a high level of student engagement and a vast range of supportive evidence. ❖ Our Funding Our Future campaign was based on a referendum of the student body. We took over 400 students to London to March and over 50 students to Lobby in Parliament. ❖ Moving forwards, we need to continue to ensure that the widening participation agenda is not lost, make sure any cuts or increase in fees are in the best interests of students and also work to safeguard the jobs of staff. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Support.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Based on research we are aware that one way in which HUU needs to develop is to offer more academic support. ❖ If re-elected I hope to work more with the Study Advice Service and HUU's Advice Centre and establish a way in which the Education Zone can promote students to develop their academic skills and help them to resolve any educational problems they may incur whilst at University. ❖ I also hope to extend our services out to often overlooked demographics of students such as Mature, Part-Time and Placement students. Next year I hope to deliver online Course Rep training and develop an eBridge site that suits their needs.
